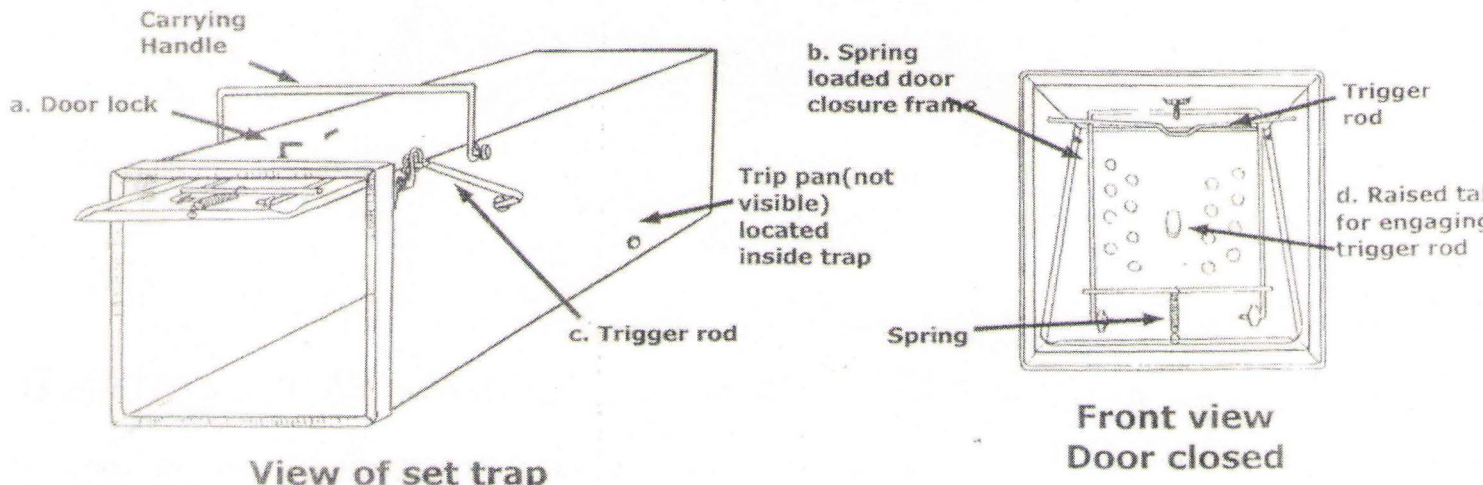


# Setting Instructions for Dura Poly Live Catch Traps

**Caution:** Do not attempt to handle captured animals. Do not leave children unattended near a captured animal. The captured animal will usually feel safe inside this trap. To release the animal, approach the trap quietly and cautiously so you do not excite the animal.



1. Lift (a) door lock.
2. Push (b) spring loaded door closure frame back so that it sits flat against the trap door.
3. To set the trigger, lift bottom of trap door up and engage (c) trigger rod into (d) raised tab.
4. Place bait behind trip pan.

1. Soulevez (a) la porte serrure.

4. Appatez le piege en deposant de la nourriture derriere le plateau de détente.

## Trapping Tips

- Firm contact with the surface is required.
- Make sure the trap cannot roll over.
- Use of gloves will eliminate the human odor.
- Washing the trap after a catch is recommended.
- Provide shade in hot weather and check your trap regularly.

## Problems: Bait missing, trap not set off?

- Check to see that mice are not stealing your bait.
- Lubricate hinge on door, trap pan and trip rod with vegetable spray or shortening.

## Bait guide

- Cats: fish flavoured cat food, meat, sardines.
- Skunk: rotten eggs, egg shells.
- Rabbits: fresh vegetables, eg. Carrots, lettuce, alfalfa pellets.
- Raccoons: Stale doughnuts, tarts, marshmallows.
- Woodchuck: String beans, corn, lettuce, peas, apples.
- Mink: Chicken, sardines, bacon.
- Muskrat: Apples, carrots, parsnips & other vegetables.
- Chipmunks, Squirrels: Unroasted peanuts, peanut butter, grains, sunflower seeds, cereal.
